

## **SHEENA EASTBURN**

Sheena Eastburn was given a life without parole sentence for her role as an accomplice to a 1992 murder that was committed when she was 17 years old. Our firm has represented Ms. Eastburn for more than a decade in attempting to secure her freedom. In 2012, the Supreme Court declared that mandatory life without parole sentences for juveniles were unconstitutional in *Miller v. Alabama*. As a result, after a difficult negotiation period, Sheena had her conviction and sentence reduced to 30 years imprisonment and was paroled in November of 2017 after she had served exactly 25 years in prison. Sheena has been working part time as a dog trainer and in other jobs and hopes to return to school and become a paralegal.
